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A couple of pleas please:

Having had our previous goal posts broken by children moving them and swinging on them before and after school, we have invested in new posts this term. Please can we ask for your support in requesting that children do not use **any** of the equipment before and after school? We simply cannot afford to keep replacing damaged equipment and our clubs (Aviary and Sports) are desperate to get outside at this time of year. We will have to remove the goal posts from the field altogether if they suffer any further damage and this will be devastating to the children, particularly at lunchtime. All children and parents should be off site swiftly after school, but definitely by 3:40 pm please. In addition, can we please remind you of our before and after school gottes. Please ask your child to dismount their scooter or bike on entering the school gates. This is for safety reasons; there are simply too many little people around at that time of day and they frequently get hurt. Also, just as with the football equipment, we ask that children do not play with or on any of the school equipment at the beginning or end of the school day. This avoids costly breakages and damage as well as injuries.

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Ampthill vs Cancer 5k:

We are reaching out to invite Russell Lower School families to be a part of something truly special this summer. On Sunday, 29th June the Ampthill community will come together for the first-ever *Ampthill vs Cancer 5K*—an event designed not only to raise vital funds for local cancer charities, but to bring our town closer together through solidarity and hope.

While the event is open to everyone, we are especially excited to invite your students to participate in the **Golden Hare Mile**—a fun, family-friendly race where children (aged 12 and under) can run, jog, or walk in honour of a loved one or simply to show support. This special event is inspired by the legendary treasure hunt from the book *Masquerade*, which once led to the discovery of a golden hare right here in Ampthill Park.

In addition to the Golden Hare Mile, we also have a full 5K race for adults and family members. But it's not just about running—it's about coming together as a community to support three amazing charities that help our neighbours and loved ones who are battling cancer:

- **The Primrose Car Service** (part of Bedford Hospital Charity & Friends) offers free transport for local cancer patients to Addenbrooke's Hospital and is run by a team of volunteers.
- Willen Hospice provides comfort and care for those with terminal illnesses.
- Addenbrooke's Charitable Trust, which is the cancer hub for our region, supports pioneering cancer research and life-saving treatments.

Every step taken during this event will help fund these vital services.

We would love your support in spreading the word to pupils and their families. **Attached** is a flyer about the Ampthill vs Cancer event, and the Golden Hare Mile that provides more information about the event. We kindly ask if you can share it with parents and carers via school communications.

The Golden Hare Mile is a wonderful way for children to get active, and be part of a cause that will make a real difference in the lives of local families affected by cancer. It's also a great way to inspire a sense of community and solidarity in our next generation.
