| 1            | use different types of lead pencil to show texture using line and tone.                                  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Different pencils give different tones.</li> <li>• Tone is the degree of lightness or darkness.</li> <li>• Texture is the feeling, appearance or consistency of an object or material.</li> <li>• Artists try to replicate the texture of the subject to make their work look as realistic as possible.</li> </ul>  | See lynx files             |
| 2            | With a variety of pen types, make a variety of lines free-flowing, sweeping, broken, faint & hard.       | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A line is a connection between two points.</li> <li>• Lines can also be horizontal, vertical, diagonal, straight, curved, thick or thin.</li> <li>• Contour lines are the outlines of an object, shape or form.</li> <li>• A short, thick, straight line conveys a different feeling or emotion to one that is long, thin and swirly.</li> <li>• Line can give an object the appearance of it being 3-dimensional.</li> </ul> | See lynx files             |
| 3            | To create images in the style of an artist from history and explain how their work is similar/different. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Henry Moore was a famous artist and sculptor.</li> <li>• He was inspired to draw sheep from the Yorkshire countryside near where he lived as a child.</li> <li>• Henry Moore used sketches are often made with a ballpoint pen, with swirling lines and zigzags.</li> </ul>   | See lynx files             |
| 4 and 5      | To select the brush size and type to create an image with a set coloured background.                     | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lauren Terry is an artist that paints cows with a set colour background to make people smile.</li> <li>• Focus on facial details, nose eyes and ears.</li> <li>• Add texture to show the hairs and the softness of a cow's hide.</li> <li>• Add a contrasting background to bring out the cows features.</li> </ul>   | See lynx files             |

| <b>6 and 7</b> | To recreate art work in the style of Paul Nash | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Paul Nash was a war artist employed by the government to record the events of the war through drawings and paintings.</li> <li>• The government wanted WW1 to be represented through art: to show the experience of war, to remember the fallen and as a means of propaganda.</li> <li>• Use landscapes including natural scenery such as forests, mountains, rivers and valleys to show the experience of WW1.</li> </ul> | See lynx files |
